From the Pastor's Desk—April 2024

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations." (Matthew 28:19a)

My dear friends in Christ,

We have entered the Easter season and, as we do so, we recall the gifts of our risen Lord who brings new life into a world inclined to a fair measure of religious lethargy. In Christ, we find the strength to persevere in our conviction to do the work of his Kingdom on earth and to be the people of faith he invites us to be.

The disciples had a hard time, at first, receiving the good news of Jesus' resurrection and welcoming his gift of peace. But the women persisted in sharing that news and, as "they say," the rest is history.

While Christianity continues to grow in other places of the world, the U.S. is another story and the *good news* is being shared less and less. A recent Gallup poll reveals that 56% of Americans say they seldom or never attend religious services. Gallup concludes that, "The most popular church in America might be St. Mattress, followed by Bedside Baptist. Those two—euphemisms for sleeping in on Sundays—increasingly describe the attitude of many Americans toward attending churches or other houses of worship."

Many churches in America have experienced a significant decline in participation and the pandemic left in its wake some serious fissures in the foundations of many faith communities. While the Roman Catholic church has seen the largest downturn, even those traditions with the highest expectations for regular involvement (such as the Latter-Day Saints) have witnessed serious falloff. According to Gallup, "Overall, the percentage of Americans who never attend services has more than doubled since the early 1990s."

Yet, that doesn't mean people have stopped yearning for a relationship with God. It more likely means that people are not being spiritually fulfilled at the churches and synagogues of their youth and are seeking that fulfillment elsewhere.

What do we in established churches do with this news?

We begin by recognizing that resurrection requires death—perhaps to the traditions and customs of a prior era that are more preference-driven than biblically based and do not resonate with those of younger generations. We move from there to asking, "What does God require of us in this changing era?" and "Are we willing to open ourselves up to God's leading in a new day, with new ideas, new plans, new energy?"

The congregational survey that so many of you participated in has given the Mission Study Team a good sense of the level of openness to the Spirit's leading, and we want to thank everyone who submitted a survey for your time and consideration. We will share with you the results of that survey soon.

Meanwhile, as we consider what's next for the people of God at the First Presbyterian Church of Verona, we continue to dwell in the peace of Christ knowing that we've been blessed with an Easter resolve to bring new life to our Kingdom work and new energy to our ongoing witness to Christ: sharing the good news of the One who comes in peace to bring grace and wholeness to a world suffering with heartache, greed, and a certain level of self-involvement.

We are an Easter people. We are witnesses to the resurrection and have a God-given purpose to share the message of a living, loving Lord who seeks to be in relationship with all. May we welcome our calling and do our part to share our faith with others. Invite a friend or neighbor to church. Volunteer time in mission. Be a mentor to a Sunday School child. Offer up random acts of kindness. Initiate a small group dedicated to prayer, community building, bible study, or sharing stories of faith. Welcome those who come seeking Christ and be polite! (Never, ever open a conversation at the door to the church with anything that sounds like, "Well, where have you been?" or "Long time, no see.")

All these things and more can make a lasting difference in bringing renewal to the church while also meeting the needs of God's beloved children. Blessings to us all as we covenant to do this Kingdom work,
