Chae is currently the Associate Director, Conductor and Cantores (choir director) for the Princeton Girlchoir and the Founder and Executive Director of a professional vocal group called

Chae holds a BA in Music, Vocal Studies from Westminster Choir College. He is also the Director of the Middle School Choirs at Montclair Kimberly Academy, a position he will be leaving at the close of this semester to allow more time to pursue his master's degree.

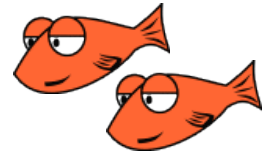

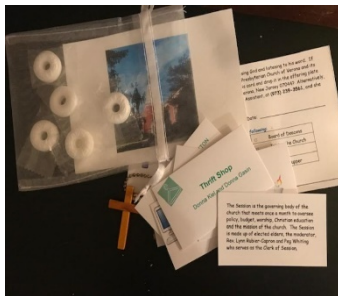
Hi Church Members and Friends:

BUILDING AND GROUNDS REPORT

- Initial survey and design work continues for the work on the new Chamberlain Hall Doors and ADA ramp (platform).
- A depression on the lawn outside the east-side door was filled by Dick Crawford and Andy Turner. A significant void was also discovered under the sidewalk and was filled. After the depression was leveled, grass was planted.
- Roof work on the entire building was completed in the beginning of June by CAD roofing. Loose roof tiles were secured and the wood box gutters on the sanctuary were sealed where needed.
- Gutter repair and cleaning was done at the manse. Recently there has been a problem of water seeping into the basement, and this work should alleviate that problem.
- The clutch of the walk-behind lawn mower was repaired in May.

UKRAINIAN RELIEF UPDATE

Thank you for your love and generosity.

We are going to continue the medical / food / toiletry collection and \$ donations through the summer. We also have a box out for pet food. The boxes are on the Ukraine table at the churches entrance. Here is an update since the last newsletter

- \$350 from sale of bracelets and donations. This was sent to WORLD CENTRAL KITCHEN for Ukraine site hit by a Russian missile. This kitchen is again up and running serving close to 1,000 meals per day. There is a documentary on World Central Kitchen by Ron Howard on Disney Plus and online at wck.org/.

"World Central Kitchen started with a simple idea at home with my wife Patricia: when people are hungry, send in cooks. Not tomorrow, today. Everyone knows that food is central to life and family all over the world. What we learned very quickly was that food is even more essential in a crisis. It all began in 2010 after a huge earthquake devastated Haiti. Cooking alongside displaced Haitians in a camp, I found myself getting schooled in how to cook black beans the way they wanted: mashed and sieved into a creamy sauce. You see, food relief is not just a meal that keeps hunger away. It's a plate of hope. It tells you in your darkest hour that someone, somewhere, cares about you." CHEF JOSE ANDRES

- **68 Cans of Food**, clothing and \$160.00 from sale of bracelets and donations we delivered to Hope For Ukraine for their refugee centers in Ukraine and Poland. This was delivered by Warren Hull on May 24th. Warren meets with Bill when he drops off the items. Warren stated "Bill doesn't speak any American! I don't know any Ukraine! Yet w4 bond with same beat of the heart .
- Warren brought 3 boxes of clothes and \$61 to Hope For Ukraine on June 9th.

Sunday Supper continues to add new recipients each month; during the month of June, we provided 30 meals. At present, half of our prepared meals are delivered to residents of the senior living facility located on Hillwood Drive in Verona. However, a good percentage is also being distributed to our very own members with the remainder delivered to local residents who we know are in need of TLC due to grief, illness, or financial difficulties.

Each month we create healthy and delicious meals by purchasing ingredients using funds from our generous donors. We then make a trip to Costco and local markets to get the freshest, most appealing and most cost-effective ingredients to prepare our dishes. We spend the Saturday morning before our Sunday Supper distribution prepping vegetables, salad and our main meal. Sharon Newkirk has made our work even easier by providing a home-baked dessert each month. With the help of Andy Turner, our oven is fired up and ready for us to cook before we arrive on Saturday morning. Preparation, cooking and clean-up is usually done by noon on Saturday and Sunday morning after church the meal bags are assembled for delivery along with the beautiful gift crafted by our SS crafters.

To “spice” things up a bit, we will be having a ***SUNDAY SUPPER RECIPE CONTEST*** during the months of July and August. The recipe can be for a main or side dish. If you have a recipe (does not have to be your own) that meets the following criteria, please submit it to Donna Lauckner or Dotty Ostella:

- Cost effective

We will select the recipe that best meets these criteria, and the winner will receive a Sunday Supper in the month of September. 1. We have learned a “poco” Spanish for our customers who do not speak English. We always have room for a Volunteer that speaks Spanish or Italian. I can cover Spoonerism.
2. We look for Brand Marks and Company names on the bottom of china, glassware and pottery. We have gotten pretty good and identifying nice china from really nice china.

3. Occupied Japan. We found that a few of our statues, dishes, ect have "Occupied Japan" on the bottom. This signifies the period that the allies occupied Japan between 1946 and April 1952. Collectors of Occupied Japan pieces insist that "Occupied" be found in the mark in order for the piece to be considered a true Occupied Japan collectible. Not all products made in Japan between 1946 and April 1952 are marked "Occupied Japan."

4. Wedding Dresses never completely go out of style. We have had some from the 30's that was purchased by a design student. A very cool one from the 70's sold last week. But our favorite was a future bride and groom stopped in and she tried on a gown that fit her as if it were made for her. She saved thousands by buying that dress.

CHURCH SECURITY SYSTEM

The Security System in FPCV is up and running. Thank you to the long hours and efforts of Mike Duhaney, Ken Lauckner and the assistance of Patti Beirne and Andy Turner.

After a few hiccups, Alen Security has come in to check out the system and retrain us to make it user friendly particularly to our renters. Suggestions:

The Lock system takes more time to function than we take to open the door so...
Please slow down to use this security system and keep us all safe!

When someone rings the doorbell:

- Press the speaker button and slowly and clearly say: "I will let you in, please wait to open the door until you hear a click. Then please wait a moment before you ring the inside doorbell."
- Lightly press key button one time and then immediately release.
- As soon as the person opens the door, press "off" button. If you do not press the "off" button the system will malfunction.
- When the person rings the inside doorbell please say: "I will unlock the door and you will be able to open it in a moment. Please wait a moment to give the tumblers a chance to drop- you will hear a click when it is ready."

Finally, I have been told that the next grant process (2022) will begin May 13, 2022. It will be capped at \$175,000 per application and WILL include the same types of security we already have PLUS also DOORS! I do not know why doors were not allowed in our grant process in 2020 but there were absolutely not when we first applied. We are fully ion the federal system now, so I am told the application process for us should be rather streamlined and less onerous than was our first grant process. I don't know if I have time for all it takes to do this for a second grant but if there is someone willing to take on this project, including doors for the front church entrances (2 on Fairview Ave.) and the Pine Street entrance as well as 1 added video intercom for Chamberlain Hall, and perhaps blast film. It won't be difficult to do. I can assist whoever might be interested.
