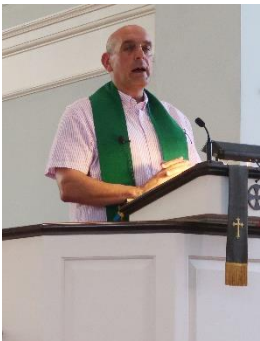

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Two months in, and I have gotten to know many of you. I am moved by the level of dedication to the church.

The HR Committee has been busy overseeing complete turnover in retiring church staff. The Buildings and Grounds Committee has tirelessly confronted the unending challenges of an old structure that isn't getting any younger. From my back yard I see how busy the Thrift Shop is three days a week, and every Sunday there's a group making sure we have a hearty spread for fellowship after worship.

As for Session, it's a tough job to begin with, all that fiduciary responsibility, but serving between ministers is especially onerous, and yours has performed with diligence and grace.

None of this even counts the work involving Christian Ed, Finance, or the Plansoen Foundation.

I'm not just saying this to be nice. Those who know me know I don't say what I don't believe and do say what I do believe whether it's nice or not. Your church is filled with hardworking, dedicated servants of God. Now to the next phase:

We need to work harder at engaging with the community. This church is more insular and inward-looking than a church should be, and that's not a criticism, it's an observation, and it's not even anyone's fault. Sometimes it just happens in a way no one notices, and it takes an outsider's eye to see it.

But the good news here is that this work has already begun. The Christian Ed. Committee bought and filled new backpacks for some West Orange students in need. On our property, The Performing Arts Project NJ hosts workshops and camps throughout the year, serving thousands of children. The Session voted to provide four scholarships this autumn for children who want to participate but can't afford it. We're also donating 30 tickets to families in need for this year's Fish Fry, and Session is working to establish a Mission Committee dedicated to serving our community and world with money and time. In other words, we're just getting started.

And I'm thrilled to be here and be part of it.

CHARLOTTE CUNNINGHAM REMEMBERED



Charlotte Cunningham, dedicated and beloved Music Director and teacher at the First Presbyterian Church of Verona for 43 years, died last fall. Family and friends remember her enthusiasm for all types of music: Her musical talent was obvious notably when performing on the piano or the organ and when directing musical performances.

She was a magical leader, especially with children learning to sing solo or in a group in front of an audience. During her time with us, Charlotte led six choirs, including two bell choirs and a men's special group.

Since Charlotte's passing, the Church Session has been thinking an appropriate way to honor and celebrate her many years with us. Now, we have found the perfect answer. The organ in FPCV needs to be replaced. At its recent June meeting, the Session voted to honor Charlotte by dedicating the new organ in her memory.

PLANSOEN GRANT

For many years, the FPCV has received a significant grant from the Plansoen Foundation. In the past and currently, the Church has requested funds for continuing support of the music program including concerts, professional musicians especially during Worship Services, maintenance of the organ and other musical instruments, and children's programs.

Previous grants have enabled restoration of the stage, new doors including an ADA- compliant door and an exterior walkway for Chamberlain Hall, completed in 2024, and support for food kitchens especially during the pandemic. Funds were used to add a much-needed ADA bathroom across the hall from Chamberlain Hall.

We are most grateful for this amazing support, all started many years ago because of the close connection of Charlotte Cunningham, former Music Director, and the Plansoen Foundation.

MUSIC MINISTRY

After a summer of learning, prayer, and practice, I'm looking forward to the return of Choir season! Choir rehearsals will be moving back to Wednesday nights to better accommodate schedules.



As we begin a new academic year, my focus will be on strengthening and maintaining resources we already have in our church and congregation. I've begun and will complete a full tuning cycle for all of our pianos and will be establishing new protocols for documenting maintenance for our instruments. Our Choir program will resume rehearsals and focus on strengthening core skills in singing such as breath support and intonation through regular singing in and out of the pews. Additionally, our Choir library is in the process of being cataloged to provide a more varied and spiritually tailored experience for those singing *and* those listening. With over 22 filing cabinet drawers full of music spanning several centuries and genres, this has been quite the task!

Lastly, I'd like to make a small note regarding our new hymnals: With the change of hymnals there is always a need for flexibility. While I do my best to make sure there is always at least one familiar hymn tune (if not text) each Sunday, I would encourage everyone to take on a student's mindset as we go "Back to School" and learn new hymns.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION COMMITTEE

And we are off and running. Sunday School resumes on 9/7 for both the younger and older classes however we got a jump start the end of August when we filled 20 backpacks for local area students in need. Students in grades K – 2 received the backpacks before the start of the school year. After filling the backs full to the brim we prayed over them that each of the students would have a good school year knowing that God loves them and is watching over them.



Cathy Franco will be teaching the upper grades and Donna Kiel will be working with Sabrina Perez teaching our younger class. Our beloved Riley Becker is not able to return this year as she is heavy into her college studies. Sabrina Perez is a Senior at Verona High School and is excited to work with Donna to create the lessons based upon Bible stories to our youngest followers of Christ.

We do need additional adults to help out during the year. Since Sabrina has not yet turned 18 we do need an adult in the room when she is teaching so please let Cathy know if you are available. Donna Kiel will be leaving the end of October so we will definitely need help through the Advent Season and the winter. Cathy is willing to teach either class so if you are more comfortable with the older class, Cathy will work with Sabrina and the younger ones. Curriculum is used and weekly lesson plans are available for substitutes to follow.

The children will be participating in the Blessing of the Animals on 9/28 and then we begin our annual Mischief to Ministry at the start of October. We will be collecting items typically used for mischief (toilet paper, shaving cream, soap, toothpaste) and donating the items to the Holy Spirit food pantry at the end of October.



In early October, the children will also be filling our “love boxes” to send to the college aged members of our church who are away at college. If families haven’t already given Cathy Franco the mailing address for their college young adult this year, or some special items that they could use, please do so.

Our annual Trunk or Treat will occur the last Sunday in October, so start thinking of what Bible story or message you want to have in your trunk for all to see.

Adults, keep your eyes out for when Pastor Erik begins his first bible study in the early fall. It will be offered in a hybrid manner as we have done in the past and it will be in the early evening, likely on a Tuesday (again). People are invited to come in-person to the church but those unable to make the trip can join via a zoom link.

Stewardship – What is Per Capita Apportionment?



"Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moths and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moths and rust do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

Matthew 6:19-21

Per capita is a set amount of money per member that congregations pay to the larger Presbyterian Church (USA). It is a way for all Presbyterians to share in the costs that belong to the whole church – like paying to belong to the internet. Our own Presbytery of the Northeast, NJ shares in the apportionment of our per capita payments. Over the past two years the Presbytery of Northeast, NJ has worked closely with us to help us in our search for a new pastor and they offer to us an array of resources that we have taken advantage of at no charge. We were also fortunate to receive a \$5,000 Grant from our Presbytery for cleaning services during covid. Based upon the membership of our church our Per Capita rate is \$38. At the present time we have an outstanding balance due, but we are hoping to get this amount paid by the end of the year. If you have already paid your Per Capita, we thank you. If not, we hope that you will consider doing so.
